Question 02

Maya's new novel won the award for the best Sinhala novel in Sri Lanka for the year 2018. Several renowned book publishers have expressed their interest in undertaking the publication of this novel. She is willing to negotiate with them. However, as she is new to the industry, she wants to know about the rights that she has in respect of the novel.

You are required to:

Explain the economic right and moral right as per Intellectual Property Act No. 36 of 2003 that **Maya** has. (05 marks)

Question 03

Amara wanted to get an insurance cover for his car from **ABC Insurance Ltd.** When filling the insurance application, **Amara** mistakenly mentioned that he parks the car inside a garage, whereas he actually parks his car in the street adjoining his house. One day, the car was damaged, while parked in the street. **Amara** wishes to claim damages from **ABC Insurance Ltd.**

You are required to:

Explain whether Amara could recover the damages from ABC Insurance Ltd. (05 marks)

Question 04

Shantha is a young businessman who recently started a shoe manufacturing company. He has managed to secure a business deal to export shoes to **"Chin Chin"**, a Thailand based business venture. They have agreed to perform the transaction through a CIF (Cost, Insurance and Freight) contract. As this is the first international transaction, **Shantha** wants to know the duties of a CIF seller under a CIF contract.

You are required to:

Explain his main duties as a CIF seller.

Question 05

Raja and **Kamani** started a partnership business to produce baby clothing. They both worked hand in hand to develop their business. However, **Kamani** found that though **Raja** has purchased clothing materials at a discounted price from a whole seller, he has sold it to the partnership business at the market price. **Raja** earned a secret profit out of this transaction and he did not share it with **Kamani**.

You are required to:

Explain Kamani's legal rights and Raja's duties in this regard. (05 marks)

Question 06

Piumi and **Namal** are children of late **Perera** who was a well-known business personality of the country. Currently **Namal** is performing as a Director of **Perera** (**Pvt**) **Ltd.**, a private limited company owned by **Perera** and he wants to appoint **Piumi** and **Sri Lal** as Directors of **Perera** (**Pvt**) **Ltd. Piumi** is 16 years old. However, **Thilak**, an existing Director objects to **Namal's** decision stating that **Sri Lal** has been convicted of an offence of cheque fraud and insider dealing about 3 years ago.

You are required to:

Discuss the suitability of Piumi and Sri Lal as Directors of Perera (Pvt) Ltd. (05 marks)

Question 07

Rajitha carried on a business of a food restaurant in Nugegoda. It was acquired by **Alina (Pvt) Ltd.** and **Rajitha** was appointed as General Manager of **Alina (Pvt) Ltd. Rajitha** was given instructions not to make any credit purchases. However, **Rajitha** continued to buy a range of beverages from **Lion Ltd.** on credit terms, as he did earlier prior to change in ownership of the business. **Alina (Pvt) Ltd.** refuses to pay for the credit purchases made by **Rajitha**.

You are required to:

Discuss whether Alina (Pvt) Ltd. can refuse to do the payment to Lion Ltd. (10 marks)

Question 08

Thara was an academic staff member attached to a State university in Sri Lanka. Her appointment letter stated that she is entitled to Employee's Trust Fund (ETF) as an employee of the university. However, at the end of 5 years of service, she decided to resign from the university to leave the country for her higher education. She needs to withdraw her ETF before she leaves the country.

Thara's husband **Shiva** works for a footwear company for more than 10 years. He joined the company on 01st March 2008 for a salary of Rs.35,000/- per month. Now he draws a salary of Rs.200,000/- per month. He also has submitted the letter of resignation with effect from 01st July 2019 to migrate with **Thara**.

You are required to:

(a)	Explain Thara, on her rights to withdraw ETF.	(05 marks)
(b)	Calculate Shiva's gratuity entitlement at the time of resignation.	(05 marks) (Total 10 marks)

Question 09

Kumara issued a cheque to **Devika** which stated "A/C payee only". **Devika** produced this at the bank and asked to cash it at the counter. Cashier refused to cash it and advised **Devika** to deposit it to her account. **Devika** was unhappy with cashier's statement, but she deposited the cheque to her bank account. Meanwhile, **Kumara** issued a stop payment order to the bank for any cheque issued under his account. Next day, when **Devika** got to know that her cheque was not realized, she went to the Bank Manager and inquired about **Kumara's** account balance and other details.

You are required to:

(a) **Explain** the validity of the cashier's statement with reference to negotiable instruments.

(b) **Explain** the duties of a banker referring to the above scenario.

Question 10

(A) Saman, an auctioneer based in Colombo advertised for the sale of furniture and other office equipment through an auction. Gajan a broker, came from Jaffna to purchase the furniture from the auction. However, later Saman changed his mind and withdrew furniture from the auction without prior notice. Gajan wants to sue Saman on the breach of contract. Nimal, another broker came from Kurunegala to purchase office equipments from the auction. He bid Rs.100,000/- for a photocopy machine and another broker, Sithum bid Rs.110,000/- for the same machine. Sithum was able to purchase the photo copy machine at the auction and announced that he will sell it for a higher price. Thus, Nimal requested Sithum to resell the machine to him for Rs.115,000/- but Sithum asked Nimal to pay Rs.120,000/- if he wants to buy the photo copy machine.

You are required to:

Discuss the following:

(a)	Whether there is a valid contract between Saman and Gajan.	(07 marks)
(b)	Whether there is a valid contract between Nimal and Sithum.	(08 marks)

(B) Sameera is a local manufacturer of bicycles in Kurunegala. His speciality is to manufacture sports bicycles. It carries the description 'made with iron and original gold plated rim which is suitable for any weather condition. Seat is adjustable to any height and handle with oval shape which enhance the speed control quality.' Nuwan lives in Nuwaraeliya and ordered a bicycle based on the description for his upcoming bicycle race in Nuwaraeliya. After two days from the order, Nuwan received his bicycle. Nuwan found that the handle is not suitable for cycling in a mountain area and seat is not adjustable to the required height.

You are required to:

(a)	Explain the rights and remedies available for Nuwan.	(06 marks)
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- (b) **Explain** the following terms in relation to law of sale of goods:
 - (i) Existing goods.
 - (ii) Future goods.
